


## **Junior News**














### **Reminders:**

### **Grade 3/4 News**

This Term Year 3 and 4 are learning about Chemical Science.

The Year 4 unit is called Material World. New materials have revolutionised modern life. Plastics have been used instead of glass in bottles and windows, and even instead of metals in aeroplanes. Lighter, stronger, warmer fabrics have made extreme weather conditions more comfortable. Designers incorporate new materials in clothes and bags to better suit our needs. Scientists are now researching materials that have desirable properties but have less impact on the environment.

The Year 3 unit is called Melting Moments. Every day we see or use things that have been melted or frozen, heated or cooled. All around us are items that we find both useful and attractive that have been moulded into different shapes using heating and cooling. These can range from cast iron frying pans and plastic rubbish bins to chocolate bilbies. Und erstanding the properties of materials and how they change state under different conditions can help scientists to develop even more extraordinary products to help improve our quality of life.

Year 3 students enjoyed investigating what happens to particular things when they were heated up.
