Fairhills Primary School is very proud of the quality programs in place to cater for the needs and interests of our students. We are looking forward to another great year of teaching and learning and would like to advise you of Fairhills Primary School's voluntary financial contributions schedule for 2025.

Schools provide students with free instruction to fulfil the standard Victorian Curriculum. As a smaller school, the budget is extremely limited. Schools are allocated funding each year based on student numbers and this is a fixed amount set in February each year. There isn't a bottomless bucket of money handed out to schools when requested.

We want to thank all parents who supported the school over the past 12 months, whether that's through fundraising, financial contributions or volunteering your time. This has made a huge difference to our school and the programs we can offer. Your support in 2024 allowed us to provide:

- Individual student books and stationery
- Art Consumables. Includes craft paper, paints, glitter and cardboard
- Printing and photocopying of worksheets and learning materials
- School sporting equipment
- Stem supplies
- Mathematics numeracy blocks etc
- ICT Devices provision of devices from the shared classroom sets (laptop and iPads)
- Online subscriptions such as Compass, Reading Eggs and Essential Assessments
- Student wellbeing programs
- Student badges and awards and Junior School Council and student initiatives
- Sick Bay/First Aid supplies and materials
- School Sports Victoria affiliation

Financial Support for Families

Fairhills Primary School understands that some families may experience financial difficulty and offers a range of support options, including:

- State Schools' Relief provides financial support for eligible families to purchase clothing/uniforms at a reduced rate
- Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund provides payments for eligible students to attend camps, sports and excursions. CSEF Funding is available for Health Care Card and Pension Card Holders
- School Saving Bonus provides \$400 in one-off support for Victorian school-aged students for use on 2025 school costs
- Payment plans for Extra-Curricular items and activities

Refunds

Parent requests for refunds are subject to the discretion of the school and made on a case-by-case basis. Refunds will be provided where the school deems it is reasonable and fair to do so, taking into consideration whether a cost has been incurred, the Department's Parent Payment Policy and Guidance, Financial Help for Families Policy and any other relevant information.
