Lots more fun has been happening in the Junior School since the last newsletter came out. In Junior School maths we have been exploring 2D and 3D shapes, making 2D shape monsters and then creating 3D models made from BluTack and matchsticks.














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In maths we have also looked at the lines of symmetry and what makes something symmetrical or non-symmetrical. We have made 2D shape monsters and named all the shapes that we used to build them. And another part of exploring 2D shapes has been working together to create a display of a tessellating hexagons and making sure that the shapes are fitted together neatly. We learnt about an artist called M.C Escher who was famous for using tessellation in his work. We also saw how Ancient Roman artisans used mosaic tiles to create tessellations in grand homes.





In Inquiry we are working our way through the biological science program "Mix it Up'. Since the last newsletter we have mixed some glue, sparkles and shave crème to make some awesome sparkly slime and made very retro lava lamps with oil, water, food colouring and Alka Seltzer.









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






Grade 3/4 News
